Readers should note that there is significant work still to be done on this project. This will affect rail services on some weekends and in particular, over the Easter period. Rail services at Eccles station will be affected then so check your journey out in advance. It looks as if trains will run from Eccles to and from Liverpool direction but not to Manchester.

Starting over the Easter weekend and continuing through April (Thursday 13 April to Monday 1st May), remodelling work will be taking place around Salford Central station. This will include widening an existing viaduct, strengthening structures, and demolishing and replacing Chapel Street bridge.

New Bailey Street bridge and a section of Chapel Street bridge will be strengthened. A crane will remove the old section of bridge and a new section will be driven into place by a Self-Propelled Modular Transporter (SPMT) – similar to the SPMT machines that transport NASA rockets.

New overhead line equipment and signalling will be installed, and track from Salford Central and Manchester Victoria will be realigned to accommodate the new layout. Middlewood viaduct is being widened, also to accommodate the new section of track.

To complete the work safely, some train services will be affected throughout the year until early October – for services coming into and out of Manchester Victoria:

- Early Thursday 13 April until the last service on bank holiday Monday 1 May
- Every Sunday from May 7 until 2 July
- Early Sunday 28 May until the last service on bank holiday 29 May
- Early Saturday 8 and 15 July until the last service on Sunday 9 and 16 July
- Sunday 20 and 27 August
- Saturday 2, 9, 16, 23 and 30 September
- Sunday 3, 10, 17, 24 September and 1 October

A replacement bus service will operate between Manchester Victoria and Salford Crescent from Friday 14 April to Sunday 16 April, and alternative routes will be open.

13th April to 1st May:

Monday to Saturday: All trains from or to Eccles and Patricroft stations will be starting or terminating at Manchester Oxford Road.

Sunday: The normal Eccles service to/from Manchester Airport will run

Passengers are advised to plan their journey ahead and check before they travel with www.nationalrail.co.uk

Northern have also produced a small (92 page) booklet giving all the changes and timetables for the period of work between 13th April and 1st May. This is available at Eccles and Manchester Victoria stations or can be downloaded here or by clicking on the image below.

Trains that run from Walkden and Bolton to Manchester Victoria will also be affected and special timetables are also available for these services.

There will also be road closures in the area due to the extensive work:

- Chapel Street between New Bailey Street and Bury Street Monday 10 April to Friday 28 April
- Yorkshire Street Friday 7 April to Friday 28 April
- Johnson Street Friday 7 April to Friday 28 April
- Browncross Street and Quay Street Friday 7 April to Friday 28 April.

Strikes to come.

Northern and Merseyrail train services were affected by a strike called by the Rail, Maritime and Transport (RMT) Union on Saturday 8th April which just happened to be the day of The Grand National Race at Aintree Race Course, Liverpool. Normally trains around Manchester and Liverpool are usually incredibly busy on this day each year which could possibly explain why this date had been chosen for the strike. The RMT is objecting to the potential introduction of Driver Only Operated trains on the two networks in a few years' time. On the Southern Network, such trains are already in wide use and being operated by ASLEF (the train drivers' union) and RMT members but the unions are in dispute over this. Indeed, the ASLEF leadership was surprised when their members on Southern voted against accepting a compromise negotiated by their union leaders.

It seems likely that there will be more strikes relating to this issue so it is worth noting what arrangements have been made by Northern for this one. Limited service will run on the strike days and be announced in advance. In some cases, there will be replacement bus services in operation. Ticket holders will be allowed to use Arriva buses on the strike day or

use the trains run by a different franchise. Season ticket holders should receive an automatic refund for each strike day.

Stations to become community hubs?

Transport for Greater Manchester is proposing that it take over the 94 railway stations in the region as part of transport devolution plans. TfGM is dissatisfied with the state of the railway stations (hardly surprising) and believes there is little incentive for improvement for holders of short franchises. It does seem possible that long term local ownership could improve things, especially if the ownership is accountable to travellers for their actions (or inactivity?). TfGM talks of £400,000,000 being made available over the next couple of decades if this transfer occurs. Station Friends Groups will need to put their thinking caps on if this ambitious plan goes ahead!

BOOK REVIEW:

'LIFE IN A RAILWAY FACTORY'

by Alfred Williams ISBN 9780750946605

Sutton Publishing £14.99 Available at Eccles Library.

Alfred Williams, born 1877, left school at 11 to work on a farm. At 15 he took up employment at the Great Western Railway's Swindon Works, and it is about his experiences in the factories there that he writes. An intelligent man, he spent most of his spare time in reading writing and self education. Thus, this book (first published 1915) is perceptive, poignant and realistic about the harsh work condition of the time, and written in lucid prose. The technical and the human issues are both covered.
