1)Gardens

If you've been out and about in Eccles Town Centre recently, you'll have noticed demolition work on the shopping centre, car park and market hall has now begun.

This is all part of the regeneration plans to revitalise the town centre and create a modern, vibrant and fit-for-purpose town centre, a place where people can live, eat, meet, and play. It is an exciting step in the programme to improve the area.

But don't forget the demolition work only affects certain parts of the town centre. The shops and businesses on Church Street are still open for business and unaffected.

Northern have introduced a revised timetable for Sunday services through Eccles in an attempt to produce a more robust service. The service is now more reliable but at a reduced frequency. However, it is still advisable to check with National Rail enquiries before travel but especially on Sundays.

The proposal by open access operator LUMO to run a service from Rochdale to London, calling at Eccles, has unfortunately not won government approval. However, LUMO and other open access operators, will continue to campaign to get approval for such services.
