

Twenty-two GLOSSOP – FOUR (or five) PUB STROLL.

Four real ale pubs in Glossop town. An easy walk to the edge of town and back inwards.

Take the train to Manchester Victoria and from there a tram to Manchester Piccadilly Station. From here catch the train (usually platform two) to Glossop.

Alight at Glossop and opposite the station is the George Hotel.
Along with a pleasant interior this pub usually sells at least two real ales in good condition.

Leaving the George Hotel turn left down to the crossroads.

At the crossroads, cross and go straight ahead up the main road for about 1/2 mile or so. Opposite The Crown go left along Freetown and walk uphill direct for about a quarter of a mile.

At the top of this series of streets turn right.

A few yards on your left is the Beehive.
This pub is open in the evenings. It does food in the evenings and sells Taylor's Landlord and at least one other guest ale.

Leaving the Beehive retrace your steps to the Crown.
This is a popular Samuel Smith's pub with a good old-fashioned interior. It appears deservedly in the Good Beer Guide. Outside The Crown turn left and follow the main road down into the town.

Go over the crossroads past the side of The Norfolk Arms.
Now refurbished and run by Joseph Holt.

The railway station is on your left. Just beyond it is The Star.
This is a Good Beer Guide Pub with an excellent range of real ales.

Don't miss the last train back to Manchester!
